

EED Article 11: challenges

Challenges with the transposition of the new EED



PRE-ASSESSMENT ON A SCALE OF 1-5 ACROSS PARTNER COUNTRIES

Adaptation of the regulatory framework (legislations, regulation, etc.) Not enough qualified auditors or energy experts in the country Ensure quality of the energy audits

Develop/update databases and platforms to collect information on audits and EnMS Support for non-obligated companies and SMEs to carry out energy audits Developments of companies' action plans

Short time for the transposition

Market players (energy service companies/auditors) not yet ready for the. Adapt training programmes and information actions to the new requirements Identification of new obligated companies (obligation linked to energy consumption...

the EED also improves the nature of energy managment within industries. It expands the scope of energy audit obligations to include all companies which targets small and medium enterprises (SMEs) with energy (EnMs) a requirement for large industrial consumers.
